

Where do Australians live?








Age of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples







Top countries of birth (2007 – 2016)

















Age diversity of migrants





Where do migrants live?






Count of people born overseas living in each state

Proportion of overseas population in each state


Religion – change over time






Religion and age






Median personal income





Changes in dwelling tenure






Housing costs – median mortgage repayment

Households paying >30% income (Mortgage)






Housing costs – median rent
